ITEM NO 3. "Public Hearing on budget and Proposed Tax Rate" As required by Truth-In-Taxation

A tax rate of \$.646166 per \$100 valuation has been proposed by the governing body of Young County. This rate exceeds the No-New-Revenue (Effective Rate) but does not exceed the Voter-Approval (Rollback) tax rates. However, state law requires that a public hearing be held by the governing body before a budget may be adopted or a vote may be taken on the proposed tax rate.

A hearing to formally adopt the budget and set the tax rates for maintenance and operation and for debt service has been set in the manner and time as required by Truth-in-Taxation, Texas Government Code, Chapter 26 and Local Government Tax Code, Chapter 111, for August 29, 2022 @ 9:30 AM in the Young County courtroom, Room 106, Graham, Texas.
